## Course Schedule

### Coursework may be completed online!

Minnesota State University, Mankato offers the K-12 Reading Licensure as an 18 month graduate level program. The coursework can be used as the focus area of a Masters degree or as a stand alone licensure.

The five courses consist of: a foundations in reading course which involves the student interacting with the most current research on teaching reading; a course in administration and supervision of reading programs; coursework in effective reading in the content areas; a course in assessment and instruction for the struggling reader; and a practicum opportunity to support the application of the knowledge, skills and dispositions of a K-12 reading specialist.

EEC 629 – Administration & Supervision of Reading Programs (2cr.) Summer

EEC 620 – Effective Reading Instruction for the Content Areas (3cr.) Summer

EEC 619 – Identifying & Helping Struggling Readers (4cr. ) Fall semester – September – December

EEC 660 – Practicum (3cr.) Spring semester – January – May
