Graduate K-12 Mentorship Placement:

If possible candidates will be clustered in areas to allow effective supervision and interaction with other members within the cohort. Placement will be made to establish an effective and professional relationship for each candidate, K-12 mentor, and school district. In requesting an assignment or self-selecting their K-12 mentor, the candidates' location, grade level, and content area will be considered in the selection process. However, some candidates may not be placed in areas requested or assigned to the mentor that they have indicated in the self-selection process due to personal connections to the school district (i.e., where relatives or friends employed), having children in attendance, and/or has attended the school recently.

Note: Candidates are not guaranteed one of the areas requested. There are many factors, besides candidate's choice, taken into account in the K-12 mentorship/student teaching placement process. During the selection and assigning process, candidates should not contact school districts regarding their placement into the mentorship program, until they have received verification about their placement. Once verified a contract will be sent out to be signed and should be returned within three weeks from the date they were mailed. It is the candidate's responsibility to make living, financial, and travel arrangements.

Area Thirteen: Common Market

Common market (for other state universities in MN) mentorship/student teaching is a program in which candidates complete their mentorship and student teaching through another state university. Additional paper work must be completed. In addition, you are bound to possible additional expectations/length of student teaching than those of MSU. Contact the Director of Clinical and Field Experiences for an interview if you are considering this option. Common Market deadlines are earlier than Minnesota State University applications for the semester.

Other State/Abroad Experiences:

If you wish to have a student teaching experience in a different state or foreign country, you may investigate this option with the Director of Clinical and Field Experiences. It should be noted that these experiences are rare and only provided on a limited and exception basis.
