Counseling and Student Personal Master's Programs

In 2018, approximately 80 students were enrolled in the Counseling and Student Personnel Master's Programs. Approximately 88% of those students enrolled are women, approximately 11% of those students enrolled are men, and approximately 1% are alternate gender. The Counseling and Student Personnel (CSP) programs are competitive and 41% of the candidates that had completed an application for the 2018-2019 academic year were accepted into their selected program. Ninety-four percent of accepted students graduate in the expected time period, which is two years for full-time students and three years for part-time students. Courses accommodate both part-time and full-time students.
