Individual Study Guidance

Purpose:

An individual study is an opportunity to earn academic credit for learning outside the formal class structure. A student who is interested in knowing more about a topic not covered in the regular curriculum may propose a research project to any department faculty member.

Pre-Requirements:

- 1. GPA: 2.5 minimum.
- 2. Courses completed: AVIA 101, AVIA 150.
- 3. Credits completed: 60 or more toward graduation, including at least 15 credits of Aviation Coursework.
- 4. Individual Studies may not be completed retroactively. This contract should be completed, signed and approved *prior* to the initiation of the project, not after it is completed.

Individual Study Credits

- Credit for an Individual Study will accrue at the rate of 1 hour for each 45 Hours of study (reference the MNSU Academic Credit Hour Definition: https://admin.mnsu.edu/organizational-information/policiesprocedures/university-policies/academic-credit-hour-definition/)
- 2. A *maximum* of one credit hour may be earned for each of the following:
 - a. UND Altitude Chamber Course Evidence must include a graduation certificate AND a research paper or presentation identifying lessons learned (length and scope as determined by the approving faculty.)
 - b. Tailwheel or High-Performance Endorsement Evidence must include a copy of the logbook endorsement AND a research paper or presentation identifying lessons learned (length and scope as determined by the approving faculty.)
- 3. Tutoring is not considered a valid Individual Study for additional credits. Students are required to tutor as part of their Instructor Pilot ground school.
- 4. A student may register for more than one AVIA 499 class but cannot earn more than a total of 3 hours in AVIA 499 credits.
- 5. Students needing two or three credits to graduate are highly encouraged to take an Aviation Elective course rather than registering for AVIA 499 credits.

Internship Study Guidelines:

Purpose:

An internship study provides students with the chance to receive academic credit while gaining valuable practical experience in the field of aviation. If a student expresses interest in earning credit for their internship, they have the flexibility to coordinate directly with any department faculty member.

Pre-Requirements:

- 1 GPA: 2.5 minimum.
- 2 Course Completed -AVIA 101 & 150.
- 3 Credits completed: 60 or more towards Graduation including at least 15 credits of Aviation Coursework.
- 4 Internships may not be competed retroactively. This contract should be completed, signed and approved prior to the internship.
